Priestly Pondering for Easter: A Day of Unbridled Joy

The Collect of the Day begins: Almighty God, who through your only-begotten Son Jesus Christ overcame death and opened to us the gate of everlasting life: Grant that we, who celebrate with JOY - Do you? Celebrate with JOY? The day of Jesus' resurrection is an occasion for great JOY. The women and the disciples move from fear to sorrow to confusion, until they see their risen Lord. Then, and only then, comes the JOY. He is risen! Christ is alive! Death is defeated and God reigns victorious.

The resurrection was a certainty because it was wrought by the power of God. It is how God chose to deal with a creation under the pall of sin and death. On that first Easter morning God reached into the tomb and raised Jesus from the dead. Unlike the resurrection, the crucifixion was not a certainty. There could have been a different outcome, this abomination brought about by human hands. Judas didn't have to betray Jesus. Caiaphas could have protected Jesus instead of turning him over to the Romans. Peter could have been brave instead of cowardly and rallied Jesus' followers to seek his release. Pilate could have been less cruel and appreciate the value of every human life. That is why God took control of human destiny. Only God can save us. Only God can decisively defeat the power of evil.

Early on that first Easter morning Peter and the disciples were in a state of shame, shock and grief - as far from JOY as they could possibly be. Jesus' death had happened so fast they were still reeling from it. All of their hopes and dreams for a new future were suddenly gone. Added to that, Peter had to cope with his three time denial of Jesus, and all of the disciples had to live with the shame and guilt of abandoning him, and all the while fearing for their very lives. What a potent mixture grief, shame, guilt, and fear can be. So, what should the disciples make of Mary's news? - She has seen the risen Lord! It is the only news that could have suddenly replaced Mary's unbearable grief with JOY.

On this day God has acted as only God can. Jesus placed himself under the power of sinful humanity knowing that God would have the final word, that the power of God far surpassed any power humans can lay claim to, or even the power of death itself. Good Friday is about the unparalleled love of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. Easter is about the power of God All-mighty. Through the blood of the cross our sins are forgiven. There is no sin that the cross does not cover - not a single one. Through the power of resurrection Jesus invites us to share with him eternal life in heaven.

While we are here in this present life, our Risen Lord invites us to be a community of believers who live with the JOY of his resurrection in our hearts. As Hymn 304 puts it:

I come with JOY to meet my Lord, forgiven, loved, and free, in awe and wonder to recall his life laid down for me.

Alleluia! Christ is risen.
The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia!

<u>Presented By</u>: The InterFaith Racial Equity Network in CNY, of which Mother Julie is a member.




