### Dear Friends,

I have spent time the last 3 days saving the trees at our new home by tearing down ivy vines from the ground to as high as I can reach. Five trees down, 7-8 to go! As I work along Jesus' parables about vines and branches and the bearing of good fruit have been playing through my mind. As a result, this weekend's collect grabbed me when I read it.

The Collect of the Day for August 27/28: Lord of all power and might, the author and giver of all good things: Graft in our hearts the love of your Name; increase in us true religion; nourish us with all goodness; and bring forth in us the fruit of good works; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever. **Amen.** 

## Petition #1: Graft in our hearts the love of your Name

Though we are created in the image of God, the love of our Lord's Name is not automatic. We need to proclaim that Jesus is Lord and ask the Holy Spirit to graft the love of the Lord into our hearts. We also need to ask the Holy Spirit to help us ungraft the things in our heart that vie to take God's place: love of money and possessions, love of power, excessive love of family, etc. As I was tearing away the vines I noticed a large difference in their thickness. Some vines were narrow and easy to remove. Some were very thick and welded to the tree, sucking the life out of it. Those thicker ones obviously had been growing there for a long time and took more effort to pry off the bark. What might have been growing in our hearts for a long time that needs to be ungrafted?

### Petition #2: Increase in us true religion

I take true religion to mean a life that is God-centered, a life where one truly desires to do God's will. True religion worships and honors God with one's whole being and not just with words said during worship services. The trees I am trying to save from dying don't have the ability to shake off the ivy vines. Someone has to free them, to help them heal. Asking God to increase in us true religion requires God's guidance and healing grace. We are not abandoned to our own devices. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you to strip away all wrong desires and instead to desire God's will.

## Petition #3: Nourish us with all goodness

God is light; in God there is no darkness at all. God desires nothing but good things for us. Does your definition of what is good agree with what God knows to be good?

### Petition #4: Bring forth in us the fruit of good works

My poor trees are slowly dying, unable to bring forth new life because the ivy vines are choking them to death. What is preventing you from living a life of faith; what's choking you so that you cannot bear good fruit? Desire God's goodness, ask for it, and be prepared for your life to change!
