

Dear Friends,

First, I want to thank Kate Bell and Steve Pekich for leading worship services for me last weekend when I was home sick. I would much rather have been in church with you! I dislike having limitations, as we all do. Some limits are forced upon us, such as when we are ill, some we set for ourselves, such as setting Monday and Friday as my days off. That got me to thinking about what limits God has set on humankind.

God designed us to live in the present. We are not permitted to know the future. Most of the time I am grateful for this. We can't dread things that will happen down the road if we don't know about them. Human existence is within the limits of time. We are meant to live in the present, to live one day at a time. I truly learned this lesson when my younger son was in elementary school. He developed migraine headaches at the age of 8. The kicker was that they began while he was asleep, so we couldn't head them off. That meant that I didn't know what the day would bring until he woke up. Talk about living one day at a time! It's a lesson I strive to remember each morning.

God gives us the resources we need for each day. For example, my grandmother worked on the underground against the Nazis in Czechoslovakia at great personal risk. On the underground she was known as 7. No one knew each others' names so that they couldn't be revealed under torture. (She was never arrested.) My mother and I often wondered if we would have had the courage to do what my grandmother Julie did. One day I finally realized that I didn't have such courage right now because I didn't need to have it. If a situation presented itself where courage was needed God would provide the courage - if I asked. Now, each morning I review the coming day with God and ask for what I need for the day. I find it helpful to ask God to make me equal to the day. As I hold many of you in prayer each morning I ask for God to equip you for today's needs. Tomorrow I will ask this of God again.

Each day we live in the present moment only. We also live in God's presence. Jesus was keenly aware of this. He and his family lived the day to day existence of first century Jewish peasants. One of the most outlandish examples of living that particular day in God's presence was the feeding of the 5000. His disciples advised him to wrap up his teaching and send the people on their way so that they would have enough time to get home for dinner or to find something to eat. Instead Jesus said, "You give them something to eat." He then fed the people with bread and fish until they were satisfied. I wonder how often those peasants ate until they were satisfied. This was a miracle of abundance, yes. It was also a miracle of kindness. In that moment they knew the power of God, had more than enough to eat, and would bring that memory with them into all their tomorrows. May you bring memories of God's abundant love into all your tomorrows.
