Last Thursday evening, like many of you, I listened to the January 6 hearing on prime time TV. Between that, the mass shooting deaths of 10 black American citizens in Buffalo, and the mass shooting deaths of 19 fourth graders and 2 teachers in Uvalde, Texas, I was both angry and be-wildered at the state of our nation. Then Friday morning on Syracuse.com I saw the article about the "March for your Life" march and rally on Saturday at noon. It provided me a way to respond positively and as a Christian to how I was feeling, so I went. About 400 of us paraded down South State Street and up Washington Street, past city hall and on to the federal building. It was festive, peaceful, and inspiring. We chanted slogans like "Stop the silence. End gun violence."

At the rally we sang and listened to a number of speakers. Did you know that the leading cause of death of people under age 25 is guns? Not cancer, not car accidents, guns. There were three high school students who spoke about how the school shootings affect them. One of them recited the names of the students who died at Columbine in 1999. He recites them every day. A teacher spoke powerfully about the measures she and her fellow teachers had to take to ensure safety, and about her dread in addressing her high school students the morning after Uvalde. Three local parents who had lost children to street violence also spoke, among others. People spoke about responsible gun ownership. Many spoke about how there is no other purpose for an AR-15 other than to kill a lot of people quickly. They questioned why we register our cars, but not our guns.

On my way to Emmanuel after the rally I stopped at a Wendy's drive thru to get a salad. Ahead of me was a truck with the following on its rear windshield:

Live, love, laugh If that doesn't work Load, aim, fire

We have much work to do.

Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ told us to turn the other cheek, in other words, not to respond to violence with more violence. "You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.' But I say to you, do not resist an evildoer. But if anyone strikes you on the right cheek, turn the other also." That remains the gold standard for Christians. Peaceful protest not only is our right as Americans, it is a key tool for Christians to speak to the world.


