

Ten Reasons Believers Don't Pray

From: Learning to Pray: A Guide for Everyone, by James Martin, SJ, pages 3-9

- 1. They weren't taught. Pray was never part of their world.
- 2. They consider prayer something reserved for holy people, not them. "Oh, I can't pray. I'm no Mother Teresa!" or "I could never do that, because I'm not that religious."
- 3. They've been told that they're praying wrong, or they believe prayers have to be lofty and follow certain formulas.
- 4. They're turned off by religion and are therefore turned off by prayer.
- 5. They've never been encouraged to think about what they already do as prayer. Prayer is conversation with God.
- 6. They've had "bad" experiences with prayer and feel they have failed at it. Sometimes people find prayer boring or that nothing happens when they pray.
- 7. They don't see the point, since God already knows what they're thinking. The possibility that God might want to listen to and accompany them on their life journey doesn't occur to them.
- 8. They're too busy. How important do you consider God? Like any meaningful relationship, your relationship with God requires time.
- 9. They're lazy.
- 10. They fear change. People may wonder, "What will happen if I keep praying?"

God desires a relationship with us and you cannot have a relationship without talking to one another. Prayer is how we communicate with, talk to, God. Prayer is powerful and God hears every single one. God's answers range from:


- 1) Yes
- 2) No
- 3) Not yet.
- 4) I have a better idea!
- 5) Some add a 5th answer: You've got to be kidding me as in "God, please let me get an A on this test even though I didn't study for it."

Talk to God throughout the day. Remember that you are ever walking in God's sight. Know that, warts and all, God loves you completely.
