Thursday is the Feast of the Ascension, the day that Jesus ascended into heaven, forty days after his resurrection. As his disciples were watching Jesus ascend two angels appeared with a message for them: This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." (Acts 1:11) Just as angels came to Mary and Joseph at Jesus' conception and filled the sky at his birth, just as angels appeared at the empty tomb and proclaimed that God had raised Jesus from the dead, now angels tell the disciples that Jesus will come again. This promise of Jesus' second coming is our holy hope for the future of humankind.

Before his ascension Jesus instructed the disciples to wait in Jerusalem to be clothed with power from on high. That will happen ten days later on the Day of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit descends in wind and flame. Jesus has not abandoned us or, in his words, "left us orphaned." The Holy Spirit makes Jesus present with us until he comes again in great power and glory.

God the Father's vindication and exaltation of Jesus Christ in the resurrection and ascension makes the evil powers of this world tremble in fear and puts them on notice that their time will come to an end. Until that time, however, the world still is held in their grip. We who live in the time between the first and second comings of Jesus Christ must choose: be overcome by the focusing on the evil or look to God in hope and trust. I've found that I've had to make that choice time and again since beginning the Sacred Ground journey of antiracism. I've had to remind myself it's not appropriate to ask God, "Why?", as in Why did you not intervene in the face of such human brutality? Why haven't you come again to vanquish the powers of evil and death? Blissful ignorance is not an option for Christians, though, so my journey continues on. Instead of asking God the wrong questions I try to reframe them. How is Jesus present in our time? Open my eyes, dear God, to see your hand at work. Show me where you want me positioned in the struggle for justice. This type of approach, reframing the questions while affirming God's presence, can be used for many kinds of situations we encounter or endure.

It would be fabulous if Jesus returned right now and ended the suffering and the struggles. Only God knows the proper time, however. In the meantime look to Jesus for strength, help, and comfort, for he has not left us orphaned or alone.

Hots Dogs in the Kingdom: May 25, 5:00-7:00 p.m. at Emmanuel


This year, in addition to inviting our neighbors, at the breakfast
