

### Dear Friends,

Who or what is in the center of your life? For me it's been things like academic ambition, infertility treatment followed by two adoption journeys, fibromyalgia, my son's brain surgery at Ohio State Medical Center and his disability, and, in between these, my center has been Jesus. Each time I realized that I had put something other than God in the center of my life I struggled to change. Each time it got easier to recognize when I'd done it, but not always easier to change!

At Emmanuel on Saturday I shared a metaphor that I find helpful. Imagine you're looking out a dirty window. What do you focus on, the dirt on the window or the beautiful flower garden on the other side of the window? When God is not in the center of our lives it's often because we're focusing on the dirt on the window, the trouble and pain we each carry with us. Another image: I once heard a sermon from a fellow seminarian who used the metaphor of jumping on a pogo stick. Whenever she looked down at the ground she fell off the stick. But when she looked up she was able to jump successfully. Her advice to us: Look up to God!

Life is hard. Life also can be beautiful. Where we choose to put our focus makes all the difference. There's a common saying that God will not give you more than you can handle. What's missing is three words at the end of that sentence. God will not give you more than you can handle with God's help. Christians have a powerful ally - our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Jesus stands at the ready to assist us, but he waits to be asked, to be invited into our life. Focusing on Jesus instead of on the problem(s) at hand requires faith, and faith requires trust. Do I trust that my son's future rests in God's capable hands?

Faith isn't automatic. It needs to be nurtured to grow. We rarely trust people we don't know without their earning our trust. God is worthy of your trust. God will never betray your trust. God, who reached into the tomb on Easter morning and raised Jesus Christ from the dead, cannot be thwarted or defeated. And God's love is as absolute as God's power. Jesus tells us, "Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for bread, will give a stone? Or if the child asks for a fish, will give a snake? If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good things to those who ask him!" (Matthew 7) God sent Jesus to us, out of love, so that we may not perish, but have eternal life. And that new life begins the moment you say, "I believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God."

"Do not let your hearts be troubled. Have faith in God, have faith also in me," our Lord tells us. May we live by those words and trust in God's goodness.
