#### **Priestly Ponderings**

Each year I reflect on tithing in the November newsletter as we enter our annual pledge drive. This year Stewardship Sunday is November 17, when pledges from both the people of St. Alban's and Emmanuel for our merger in 2025 will be gathered and blessed. (Letters will be mailed the first week in November.) Pledging is first and foremost about your relationship with God. As Jesus tells us, "Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." We cannot separate our relationship with God from our relationship with our financial treasure and possessions. The amount to be given to God is the tithe, or 10% of our net income. Most of us have to give something up in order to tithe. It may be electronics, new clothes/shoes, eating out, concerts or theatre, travel, or a variety of other things. That's why the first tenth of our income goes to God. If we only give what's left over then we know where our priorities lie.

#### Some things to consider:

Filling out a pledge is a way of practicing intentional giving. God intentionally sent Jesus Christ, through whose death and resurrection we have received forgiveness, healing, grace, and blessing upon blessing. The only thing God desires in return is our "sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving." A grateful heart is an open heart, and an open heart is a generous heart - in many and varied ways. God loves a cheerful, thankful, open-hearted giver!

Are you preparing for the pleasures of this life or for the pleasures of eternal life?

Wealth isn't good or bad, morally speaking. It is, however, a particularly powerful source of temptation. Whether a person has it and wants even more, or doesn't have it and wants it, money can lead us quickly away from God as few things can. Money and possessions capture our attention in this consumer-driven culture, and tempt us to find our security and self-worth in them. That's why it's easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich person to enter the kingdom of God. Jesus reminds us to put our trust in God and God alone.

If you're not yet tithing start by figuring out what percentage of your income you are contributing and go from there. It may be a few years before you can work your way up to 10%.

A while back the suggestion of the 50-50 tithe was suggested by the Church, 50% of your tithe to your parish and 50% to other charitable causes like Episcopal Relief & Development. I use a 2/3-1/3 model personally, giving 2/3 to my parishes.

A note here. If you are truly unable to tithe - and some of you are - remember the story of the widow's mite. Jesus was in Jerusalem watching people put their offerings into the treasury box. He remained silent as he observed rich men put in large sums of money. Then he witnessed a poor widow put in two copper coins, worth about a penny. Jesus called his disciples and praised her to them, for he knew that she had given all she could give.


Mother Julie and the People of St. Alban's Episcopal Church,
