Dear Friends,

Over the four Tuesdays of Advent I will be writing about faith, hope, joy, and love. Today's theme is faith. We cling in faith to God's promise both because it is Almighty God who has made this promise of new life to all believers, and we have thousands of years of history with our God. As the people of God we join our ancestors of the faith in walking by faith, not by sight. Noah walked by faith when he built the ark as his neighbors derided him, until the flood came and covered the earth. Abraham believed God's promise that his descendants would be as numerous as the stars, even though he and his wife Sarah were much too old to conceive children. Sarah gave birth to Isaac. Isaac's wife Rebekah gave birth to Esau and Jacob. Jacob had twelve sons, who became the forebears of the twelve tribes of Israel. From one elderly couple came the nation of Israel.

In faith Jesus' twelve disciples left home and family to follow him. James and John left their father Zebedee standing in the boat when they left. Walking by faith takes courage. It requires staking your life on the promise of God. By faith Jesus went to the cross, believing that God would vindicate him from his trial and execution as a messianic pretender. He even told his disciples that after his crucifixion and burial he would rise in three days. And so he did! On the third day God reached into the tomb and raised Jesus from the dead, for the power of the Almighty is stronger than the power of sin and death.

Without Jesus' death there would be no forgiveness of sins. Without Jesus' resurrection there would be no Christian faith. Without the power of the Holy Spirit we would be unable to keep the faith. Without the promise of Jesus' second coming we would have nothing on which to ground, by faith, our hope for humanity and for all creation.

Have you noticed the pattern here? Each time it is God who has taken the initiative; it is God who first acted and who will act once again. This we believe. This is our faith. On this we stake the salvation of our souls.


